

## Economic Impact of Tourism In Chicago 2020


## <u>Overview</u>

- Overall visitor spending in Chicago fell -63.2% to \$6.97 billion in 2020 reflecting the effects of the pandemic. Both domestic (-61.7%) and international (-75.6%) spending reflected the inability of travelers to visit Chicago.
- An estimated 67,808 tourism related jobs were reported lost in 2020. Employment losses were most pronounced in the lodging (-52,1%), retail (-45.2%), and recreation (-35.9%) sectors. These employment losses translated into a -42.0% loss in direct labor income along with a -60.2% loss in state and local tax revenue.


