HISTORY

Woodlawn first began growing in the late 19th century due to

its close proximity to the 1893 World's Fair. The historic community is bordered by lakefront Jackson Park and the Midway Plaisance, stunning green spaces that served as the fairgrounds and continue to

be popular with visitors today. In the early 1900s, Woodlawn's 63rd Street exploded into a bustling commercial district packed with retail, restaurants, and jazz clubs. While many of those original businesses are now gone, it's still home to local favorites like **Daley's Restaurant**, which originally opened to feed World's Fair workers and has been family-owned for more than 100 years. The neighborhood is also home to 40 churches, many with unique architecture and history, such as the Apostolic Church of God, calling the neighborhood home for nearly 70 years.

Woodlawn has been home to a slew of famous residents, including Pulitzer Prize-winning poet and activist Gwendolyn Brooks, author and playwright Lorraine Hansberry, Jazz musician Herbie Hancock, and the Olympic track star Jesse Owens.

• Taste a bit of history at Daley's Restaurant. Chicago's oldest **Build Coffee** restaurant. It's been the neighborhood's culinary mainstay since 1892 and family-owned for more than a century. Or enjoy a meal made with local ingredients and healthy at Woodlawn's new Let's Eat To Live Restaurant.

- Take Woodlawn's Mural Walking Tour, which hosts a variety of beautiful murals and preserved architecture, including the Home Of Emmett and Mamie Till.
- Enjoy a caffeinated beverage at **Build Coffee**, a charming bookshop that hosts gallery shows, performances, and game nights. You can also enjoy a hearty breakfast and coffee drinks at **Robust** Coffee Lounge.

Check out socially relevant contemporary art at the William Hill Gallery or the University of Chicago's multidisciplinary Logan Center for the Arts. And visit the racial barrier-breaking **Lorraine Hansberry House**, the former home of the Chicago Black Renaissance playwright who wrote A Raisin in the Sun, which premiered on Broadway in 1959.

Several CTA lines service the Woodlawn neighborhood including the 79 bus.



communities. The neighborhood is the future home of the Obama Presidential Center (opening in 2025), and it has deep roots centered in the Great Migration and Chicago's World Fair. Woodlawn also boasts many outdoor areas and community gardens, as well as a distinct architectural heritage that includes 40 majestic churches and the historic 63rd Street corridor
