Hyde Park is a historic neighborhood located on the south side of Chicago. It is known for being the home

of the University of Chicago and for its architectural landmarks such as the Museum of Science and Industry and Frank Lloyd Wright's Robie House, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The neighborhood was founded in the 1850s and became a hub for wealthy Chicagoans who built grand mansions along

Hyde Park is also known for its prominent role in African American history. It was the site of the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition, where African American intellectual and activist, W.E.B. Du Bois, organized the Congress on African American Progress. The Congress aimed to showcase the achievements of African Americans and counter the racist narrative promoted by the Exposition. Hyde Park also played a significant role in the Civil Rights Movement, with the University of Chicago being a key site for organizing and activism.

- Head to Jackson Park to see the Osaka Garden, a pristine Japanese garden, and SKYLANDING, Yoko Ono's first permanent U.S. public art installation.
- Walk out to scenic Promontory Point for sweeping lakefront views.
- Enjoy Southern cuisine at **Virtue**, helmed by Erick Williams, a James Beard Award-winning chef.

CULTURE

Today, Hyde Park is a diverse and vibrant community. It is home to many students, faculty and staff of the University of Chicago,

as well as families and professionals. The neighborhood has a thriving cultural scene with numerous music venues, theaters, and art galleries. It also boasts a variety of restaurants and cafes, reflecting the diverse backgrounds

of its residents. The annual **Hyde Park Jazz Festival**, which features local and international jazz musicians, is a highlight of the neighborhood's cultural calendar, as well as the **Hyde Park Art Fair** and **Hyde Park Summerfest**.

FUN FACT The Hyde Park Art Center has been a powerhouse on the art scene for more than 70 years, claiming the title of oldest alternative exhibition space in Chicago.

On the University of Chicago campus, you'll find striking Gothic architecture, like the **Rockefeller Memorial Chapel**, the free **Smart Museum of Art**, **The Oriental Institute**, the **Court Theatre**, and more. The university is known for world-changing discoveries, like the world's first artificial nuclear reactor that was built below the school's football stadium.

BY CAR

Hyde Park is conveniently located off of Jean Baptiste Pointe DuSable Lake Shore Drive on the lakefront. Travel south from the Loop to E 53rd St.

BY BIKE

The Lakefront Trail provides car-free biking across the length of the city and extends south to 53rd St. in Hyde Park.

BY TRAIN


You can visit Hyde Park via Metra or CTA. Take the Metra Electric line (ME) to 51st/53rd St. (Hyde Park).
