

HISTORY

Hyde Park is a historic neighborhood located on

the south side of Chicago. It is known for being the home of the University of Chicago and for its architectural landmarks such as the **Museum of Science and Industry** and **Frank Lloyd Wright's Robie House**, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The neighborhood was founded in the 1850s and became a hub for wealthy Chicagoans who built grand mansions along the lakefront.

Hyde Park is also known for its prominent role in African American history. It was the site of the 1893 World's Columbian Exposition, where African American intellectual and activist, W.E.B. Du Bois, organized the Congress on African American Progress. The Congress aimed to showcase the achievements of African Americans and counter the racist narrative promoted by the Exposition. Hyde Park also played a significant role in the Civil Rights Movement, with the University of Chicago being a key site for organizing and activism.

FUN FACT

The **Hyde Park Art Center** has been a powerhouse on the art scene for more than 70 years, claiming the title of oldest alternative exhibition space in Chicago.

On the University of Chicago campus, you'll find striking Gothic architecture, like the **Rockefeller Memorial Chapel**, the free **Smart Museum of Art**, **Institute for the Study of Ancient Cultures**, the **Court Theatre**, and more. The university is known for world-changing discoveries, like the world's first artificial nuclear reactor that was built below the school's football stadium.

GETTING THERE

BY CAR

Hyde Park is conveniently located off of Jean Baptiste Pointe DuSable Lake Shore Drive on the lakefront. Travel south from the Loop to E 53rd St.

BY BIKE

The Lakefront Trail provides car-free biking across the length of the city and extends south beyond Burham Park, with Hyde Park entrances at Hyde Park Blvd (51st St.), 55th and 57th Streets.

BY TRAIN

You can visit Hyde Park via Metra or CTA. Take the Metra Electric line (ME) to 51st/53rd St. (Hyde Park).

HYDE PARK

It was the site of the Chicago World's Fair of 1893, home to former President Barack Obama, and an incubator for Nobel Prize winners — basically, history is made in Hyde Park. This culturally rich neighborhood is bookended by two of the city's most significant institutions — the University of Chicago to the west and the Museum of Science and Industry to the east. Hyde Park has gorgeous green space, access to the sandy lakefront, never-ending cultural offerings, and a lively mix of retail and entertainment choices.

INSIDER TIP

You can't miss a trip to the **Museum of Science and Industry**, it's the largest science museum in the Western Hemisphere. The museum boasts more than 2,000 exhibits — from U-boats and airplanes to coal mines and tornadoes.
